**Did You Know?** The 1995 10 Year Anniversary set featuring four Proof Gold Eagles and a special One-Ounce Proof Silver Eagle bearing the "W" mint mark produced the first Silver Eagle to bear the "W" mint mark. This Silver Eagle has the lowest mintage for any Silver Eagle coin. These Silver Eagles are selling on EBay for more than \$3,000.
